Harmony Icelandics, Truro, Iowa September 21 & 22, 2024



CMO is a timed event covering 5 to 15 miles on horseback. Riders attempt to find 5-10 markers using a map and compass. Riders may compete as individuals or

teams. A pre-ride clinic and practice session precede each ride. You will need an orienteering compass (example: Silva 7), available at many camping and discount stores. (For more info - www.NACMO.com)

WHERE: Harmony Icelandics, 3263 Rustic Trail, Truro, IA 50257 https://goo.gl/maps/FY5KupJHJBsc5hZ7A

DIRECTIONS: Take I-35 to exit 47 west toward Truro. In Truro, turn south on West Street. In about 1 mile, turn west (right) on 318th Street, in a little over another mile, turn south (left) onto Timber Ridge Lane. In a short half mile, turn west again (right) onto 320th Street. Yet another mile and you will turn south onto Settlers avenue, and one more mile then turn west onto Rustic Drive. This will take you to the Imposing rock gateposts of Harmony Icelandics. Follow the drive west to the first barn where we will camp for the weekend. We'll have plates at all the corners!

TRAILS: Majority are wide mowed, some gravel mixed with grass and dirt. Shoes allowed but not required.

Non-members \$15.00/day for adults, \$10.00/day for juniors

Camping FEES: \$30 for the weekend. Primitive Camping, portable pens welcome

\$10 parking & trail use for day riders (non-campers)

POT-LUCK: Saturday night pot-luck dinner for all interested. Bring your own plates, utensils, beverage, and a dish to share.

Ride management plans to provide hot dogs, buns, and condiments.

Please Note:

State regulations require horses, mules and donkeys being transported interstate (from one state to another) must have a current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (health certificate) and negative Coggin's test (EIA). This paperwork must accompany the animal into the State of Iowa.
